Emma's Revolution is the dynamic activist duo of **Pat Humphries** and **Sandy O**, winners of the John Lennon Songwriting Contest Grand Prize and the Phil Ochs Award. Their songs have been sung for the Dalai Lama, praised by Pete Seeger, and covered by Holly Near. With beautiful harmonies and genre-defying eclecticism, they deliver the strength of their convictions in an uprising of truth and hope for the resistance. Their latest CD, *Revolution Now*, garnered Top 2017 acclaim from folk radio stations across the country, including Top Artist #20 (just after Joan Baez), Top Album #24 (just after Bela Fleck) and Top Song #25 (just after Rhiannon Giddens) for their song, "Sing People Sing," a loving tribute to the late Pete Seeger, who was a friend and mentor to the duo.
