Pamela Jean Agaloos

Pamela Jean Agaloos is an active musician in the Irish/Scottish trad scene in New York City. Born to Filipino parents on a U.S. Naval Base in Chicago, she has a background in musical theater in the Philippines, where she lived until 2011. Pamela has been invited to some of the city's premier folk sings, including Exceedingly Good Song Night and the Sunnyside Singers Club, and she has also been a guest vocalist for the band New York Brogue. Although a frequent figure in the Manhattan trad scene, Pamela makes the Iona Bar in Williamsburg, Brooklyn, her session home.

Cactus Rose NYC

Cactus Rose NYC is a native americana trio featuring indigenous vocalist/songwriter/model/activist **Kandia Crazy Horse** (Pamunkey), indigenous guitarist **Lonnie Harrington** (Seminole/Shawnee/Choctaw/Cherokee) and **Diego Retana** (Costa Rican/American) on banjo. Influenced by Richie Havens, Buffalo Springfield, Cherokee folksinger Karen Dalton, Kiowa Apache Mary Noel Singing Bear/Mary McCaslin, and Buddy Red Bow, their music focuses on experiences of urban natives and the breadth of Indian Country. Cactus Rose NYC's debut EP *Live From Lenapehoking: Field Recordings* is available now from Bandcamp. They perform sounds that unify southeastern roots music and Laurel Canyon styles with indigenous futures. cactusroselovesyou.com

Lisa Gutkin

Lisa Gutkin has crafted a courageously varied artistic career. She is a member of the Grammy-winning Klezmatics, co-founded the Downtown Celtic band Whirligig, was a co-creator of the Tony Award-winning play *Indecent*, and had a cameo in *Sex and the City*. Her song "Gonna Get Through This World" - with words by Woody Guthrie - was hailed by Pete Seeger, as "a piece of genius." Lisa's voice has been praised by the *LA Times* as "hauntingly emotional." Tonight's concert will be a whimsical wander through her musical styles, featuring Lisa on fiddle, tenor guitar, and voice, with **Mike Kobetitsch** on guitar and mandolin and **Gilad Ephrat** on double bass. lisagutkin.com

Judy Kass

Judy Kass is an award-winning songwriter based in the NY Hudson Valley. She draws in her audience with soulful vocals, no-nonsense lyrical storytelling and genre-bending exploration of guitar and piano. Growing up in a family of musicians, Judy began playing at an early age, moving from her classical piano training to accompanying the songs she soon started to write on both keyboard and guitar. Judy's 2014 debut album, *Better Things* and her 2016 CD, *Beyond the Ash and Steel* both received notable airplay, appearing on the Folk DJ List of Top Albums for those years. Her latest solo album release, *New Skin*, debuted at #4 on the Folk Alliance Top Albums Chart in 2025. Judy also performs as a member of the acoustic trio "Us!" with Glen Roethel and Amy Soucy.

James Margolis

James Margolis is a powerhouse guitarist, songwriter, and singer inspired by Delta bluesmen like Skip James, Chicago's Magic Sam, American folk music, jazz, outlaw country, soul, and hip-hop. Possessing a voice compared to Frank Sinatra, he soulfully belts while finger-picking like Doc Watson. Margolis honed his voice busking on NYC subway platforms and has since toured the East Coast and beyond, opening up for the likes of Willie Watson (of Old Crow Medicine Show).

Reggie Harris & Pat Wictor

Reggie Harris is an accomplished songwriter/singer whose intuitive creativity has made him one of the leaders of the folk tradition. As Musical Education Director of the Living Legacy Project, he works to increase knowledge of the Civil Rights Movement. Reggie's 2024 memoir *Searching for Solid Ground* is an honest and deeply rich journey into the career of a musician who has survived systems of racism and societal trauma to become a worldwide inspiration.

Pat Wictor burst on the acoustic music scene as an innovative slide guitarist with memorable interpretations of traditional and contemporary songs. He has since become an acclaimed singer-songwriter. Always a sought-after collaborator and session musician with dozens of recording credits. Pat has been nominated for Folk Alliance Emerging Artist of the Year, for the Gospel Song of the Year by the Independent Music Awards and was a finalist in the Kerrville New Folk songwriting contest. His new CD, *FLARE*, reached #1 on the Folk-DJ charts, as did his song, "How Will They Tell It." Pat is truly one of a kind.
